Assessment Practice



What is assessment practice?

To help teachers evaluate student progress in reading (and/or writing), standardised assessments like PISA, PIRLS or the NAEP are conducted on a yearly or triannual basis. These standardised assessments evaluate student reading and/or writing skills, and some also evaluate student knowledge of grammar conventions. They are typically completed on paper-and-pencil tests but are increasingly moving to a universal online format.

Standardised assessments assess literacy skills that students are learning through their school curriculum and allows teachers and parents to see how students or their children are progressing against national standards and over time.
