What is Early Years Literacy?

Early years literacy involves the development of children's language and literacy skills, from developing their awareness of how words are made up of sounds to building their alphabet and vocabulary knowledge.

Early years literacy involves developing pre-reading skills:

Early Years Literacy	Oral Language:	the ability to understand and use language through listening and speaking
	Phonological Awareness:	the ability to realise the difference between similar-sounding speech sounds and words.
	Print Awareness:	understand that printed symbols (including letters and words) carry meaning
	Alphabet Knowledge:	ability to identify and say the names of letters in the alphabet
	Book Knowledge:	understand what a book is and how it is to be used and read
