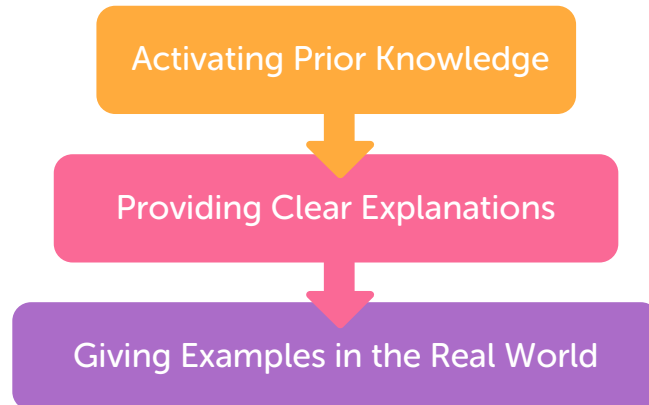


What is Explicit Instruction?

Explicit instruction involves:



To help ensure students build upon what they know and can do, the teacher models and demonstrates the skill while gradually reducing the level of support.
