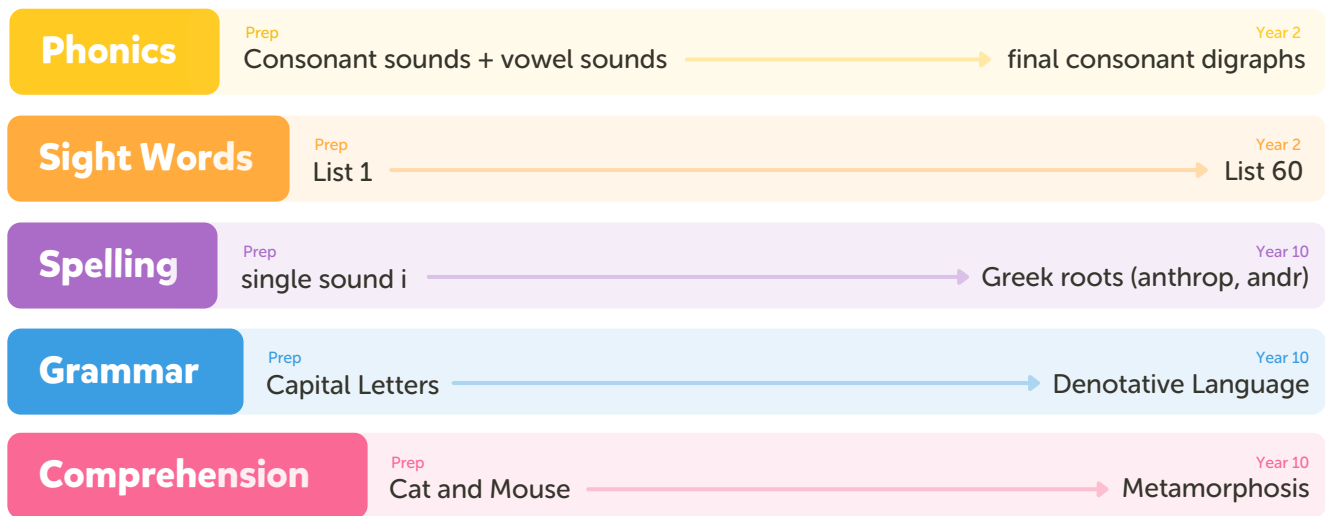


What is a literacy continuum?

A literacy continuum (aka literacy progression) outlines the core building blocks of literacy development - from emergent to proficient. It includes the incremental steps of learning - beginning at foundational literacy concepts in each strand and progressing to advanced skills. Think of it as a progress chart for building literacy skills.

How LP does it

LiteracyPlanet's Literacy Continuum reflects the organisational structure of national and state standards. Teachers can use the program guides (ie. the Phonics, Sight Words, Spelling, Grammar or Reading Comprehension Guides) to see pre-requisites and to help plan their lessons.

Each curriculum guide outlines the progression of skills from Prep to Year 10. They include every concept students will learn, as well as the optional or additional concepts that are available for teachers to assign.
